- 1. Realistic Urban Training (RUT) 16-1 is a Commanding General, I Marine Expeditionary Force (I MEF) directed exercise to be conducted from 11-23 June 2016 at numerous training locations throughout the southwestern United States. The purpose of the exercise is to provide the 11th Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU) the opportunity to conduct training in unfamiliar environments during the intermediate phase of its pre-deployment program. During RUT, the 11th MEU will be required to conduct a series of challenging and realistic training events to test its ability to conduct conventional and specialized missions.
- 2. Expeditionary Operations Training Group (EOTG) is the unit responsible for the planning and execution of this exercise and respectfully requests your support. This letter outlines specifics regarding the training exercise and requests authorization to utilize your facility located at 2600 East College Parkway, Carson City, Nevada 89706, hereinafter referred to as "KCXP."
- 3. The scheduled RUT will require select members of the United States Marine Corps (USMC) to plan and execute two raids on 18-19 June 2016 in order to neutralize fictitious enemy cells located at two training sites. In order to facilitate these missions, members of the 11th MEU will be required to establish a forward staging base (FSB) from which to plan and launch these missions. KCXP has been identified as a preferred location for an FSB.

- 4. EOTG respectfully requests access to KCXP from 15-19 June 2016. No earlier than 0800 on 15 June 2016, a site control team will arrive to prepare KCXP for the event. Starting no earlier than 1200 on 15 June 2016, up to (200) Marines and a variety of military aircraft including up to four MV-22B Ospreys, two CH-53E Sea Stallions, two UH-1Y Hueys, two AH-1Z Cobras, two MH-60S Sea Hawks, and one KC-130J Hercules from 11th MEU will arrive at KCXP to begin planning operations and will remain until no later than 1200 on 19 June 2016. Personnel will sleep in a hangar provided by Sterling Air, Limited.
- 5. Operations at KCXP will not include any firing of ammunition; however, Marines will have their government weapons and equipment.
- 6. EOTG will provide Officers, Staff Non-Commissioned Officers, civilian contractors, and a Special Agent from the Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS) as site controllers throughout the exercise. They will be responsible for safety as well as coordination and liaison with personnel from your organization and local law enforcement. In addition, they will ensure that KCXP is returned to pre-exercise condition upon completion of the training exercise.
- 7. Per the references, EOTG will coordinate with the I MEF Public Affairs Officer (PAO) to develop a prepared press release that will assist in notifying the local populace of the training exercise and minimize the impact on the community in which this exercise will take place.
- 8. The USMC, as an entity of the United States Government, is a self-insuring agency; therefore, all military personnel functioning within the scope of their employment, to include the specific activities mentioned herein, have complete medical coverage and benefits with the United States Government for any injury suffered during the scope of their employment. Additionally, if any service member during the scope of their employment causes either property damage or personal injury to a third party, the United States Government will compensate the injured third party through either the Military Claims Act or the Federal Tort Claims Act. The USMC will be responsible for processing any claims against the government which may result from this training exercise.
