#### E. PUBLIC COMMENT

(5:35:26) – Chairperson Golden entertained public comments; however, none were forthcoming.

#### F. PUBLIC HEARINGS

#### 1. INFORMATION: NEW BOARD MEMBER INTRODUCTION (TIM PULIZ).

(5:32:28) – Chairperson Golden introduced Member Puliz, who was sworn in by Ms. Warren.

#### 2. FOR DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: APPROVAL OF THE ANNUAL AUDIT REPORT OF THE CARSON CITY AIRPORT AUTHORITY FOR FY 2018/19.

(5:35:46) – Chairperson Golden introduced the item. Beth Kohn-Cole, CPA, Eide Bailly LLP, presented the audited financial statements, incorporated into the record, ending on October 31, 2019 and responded to clarifying questions. Member Simmons requested to review the report in advance in the future.

# (5:48:30) – MOTION: Trustee Rogers moved to approve the Annual Audit Report of the Carson City Airport Authority for FY 2018/19.

#### 3. FOR DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTON: SET PARAMETERS FOR DEVELOPMENT OF AN INTERMEDIATE AND LONG-TERM CAPITAL PLAN.

(5:49:33) – Chairperson Golden introduced the item. Mr. Moen presented the Board Memorandum and Airport Capital Improvement Plan, both of which are incorporated into the agenda materials. Trustee Rogers stated that he and Mr. Moen were looking for the Board's opinions on "whether [they] want to continue to do no capital planning and deal with capital needs when they come up," or if they would rather do capital planning, and if so, what the best way to fund a capital account would be.

(5:59:01) – Chairperson Golden emphasized that the expectation for the item was to give direction to Mr. Moen and Trustee Rogers rather than to take immediate action. He also stated that he would like to see something "in the form of a plan" for the Members to consider. Vice Chairperson Harris noted the importance of figuring out the potential costs before figuring out where the money would be attained from, and he suggested not to "try and make it perfect" and instead focus on creating a general idea that could be refined in the coming year so there is "some sort of mechanism in place." Member Simmons stated that he would like to see the plan details such as the capital expenditures and desired assets in a prioritized list to ensure that purchases are made with a "predicted purpose."

(6:04:09) – Member Barrette agreed with Vice Chairperson Harris's recommendation and stated that Mr. Moen should determine "when [he will] need what, and then come back with a plan." Member Puliz was in favor of this plan.

(6:06:37) – Discussion ensued among the Members regarding determining items to fund. No public was available to comment.

#### 3[4]. FOR DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: NEXT CCAA BOARD MEETING DATE.

(6:12:53) – Chairperson Golden introduced the item and entertained public and staff comments; however, none were forthcoming.

# (6:13:49) – ACTION: Chairperson Golden cancelled the December 2019 CCAA meeting and wished to consolidate the December 2019 CCAA agenda with that of the January 15, 2020 meeting.

#### G. AIRPORT ENGINEER'S REPORT.

(6:14:10) – Chairperson Golden introduced this item and requested that the Airport Engineer's report and Airport Manager's report be combined. Mr. Moen referenced the Airport Engineer's report, which is incorporated into the record, and clarified the issue with the trash grate referenced in the previous month's report, noting it would require a mechanical method to raise it during an event. He stated that a grate with floats to rise automatically as water rises is what the Carson City Storm Water Engineer is looking for. He also responded to the Members' questions.

#### H. AIRPORT MANAGER'S REPORT.

(6:17:18) – Mr. Moen presented his report, which is incorporated into the record, and responded to the Members' questions. Chairperson Golden suggested a letter writing campaign from the Airport's tenants and users to the state's congressional representatives in support of the Airport.

#### I. LEGAL COUNSEL'S REPORT.

(6:32:07) – Chairperson Golden introduced the item. Mr. Tackes noted that:

- 1. The loan documents on the financing of the tractor were "really standard" and "typical" from a bank's standpoint.
- 2. Due to the cancellation of the December 2019 CCAA meeting, the Board could call a special meeting if there was something important to meet on.
- 3. Dennis Giangreco of Sierra Skyway, Inc. returned the "other portions of his lease" back to the Airport.

(6:35:19) – Chairperson Golden reported that NDOT had acquired two new aircraft.

#### J. TREASURER'S REPORT.

(6:29:10) – Chairperson Golden introduced the item. Treasurer Rogers stated that there are "no significant deviations from [the current] budget that need to be brought up at this meeting" and requested an update from Mr. Moen on the purchase of a tractor that was discussed in the previous meeting. Mr. Moen stated that he did seek funding with help from the Chair by sending an email to US Bank and noted that they would borrow \$49,999 from the bank at 3.99% for a four-year term. He also mentioned that he had with him the paperwork to be signed by the Chair and guaranteed receipt of the funds in December.

#### K. REPORT FROM AUTHORITY MEMBERS.

(6:38:44) – Mr. Moen reported on the presentation and survey he administered to the Carson City Men's Club, during which he stated he had "about a 50/50 split" response for changing the name from Carson City Airport to Carson City-Lake Tahoe Airport and pointed out that he used this information to "refine" the survey to get feedback in December. Mr. Moen reported doing some "cleanup" around College Parkway and meeting with a landscape architect. He also stated that he would be speaking to the Rotary Club on November 26, 2019.

(6:41:02) – Chairperson Golden referenced the Carson City Airport Annual Work Plan, incorporated into the record, and stated that he believed that hosting a community fly-in should be done next year because it is "easily attainable." He also volunteered to work with Mr. Moen on this project.

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

Review and adopt the Airport Emergency Plan (AEP).

#### **PURPOSE**

Staff seeks to review and adopt the draft Carson City AEP. Development and implementation of the AEP is in support of strategic goals of providing for the safety and security of airport users and Airport administration.

#### **BACKGROUND**

As a part of the airport manager's initial action plan, he identified that the Carson City Airport did not have an established AEP on file. During a meeting with Sheriff Kenny Furlong and Fire Chief Sean Slamon, the airport manager inquired about an airport emergency plan and was advised that a detailed written plan did not exist.

On May 2, 2019, the airport tractor caught fire and resulted in an emergency response by the Carson City Fire Department 52 (CCFD). During this incident and subsequent debrief with Station 52 Captain and CCFD Battalion Chief, the need to develop an airport emergency response plan was identified in order to ensure safe and swift response by fire personnel when responding to an airport emergency.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The draft AEP was developed with the use of a base template and modified to meet the needs of the Carson City Airport. The draft has been reviewed with the Carson City Sheriff's Department (CCSD), CCFD and Carson-Tahoe Hospital. Comments and suggestions from the parties were incorporated into the final document. Airport staff is requesting that the CCAA adopt of the draft AEP as the working plan for a variety of airport emergencies. After adoption by the CCAA, next steps will include briefing CCSD and CCFD personnel on the contents of the plan and the roles and responsibilities of first responders. The culmination of all these efforts will result in planning a tabletop exercise followed by walk through exercise.

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

Review and discuss draft proposed FY2020/21 budget and proposed draft Airport Rates and Charges.

#### **PURPOSE**

Per Nevada Revised Statutes the Carson City Airport Authority (CCAA) is required to prepare and submit a budget annually to the Nevada Department of taxation. The tentative budget must be approved the CCAA and published no later than April 15th and submitted to the Nevada Department of Taxation no later than June 1, 2019.

#### BACKGROUND

On May 22, 2019, the Carson City Airport Authority (CCAA) approved the FY2019/20. In accordance with Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS), the CCAA must submit a tentative budget to the Nevada Department of Taxation by April 15, 2020 and hold a public hearing to approve the final tentative budget by the CCAA in a public meeting not sooner than the third Monday in May and but later than the last day in May.

The CCAA has responsibility under NRS 354.474, Applicability to local governments; "local government" defined. NRS 354.596 details the CCAA responsibility to submit a tentative budget and includes details pertaining to budget preparation, submission and filing; notice and the requirement for a public hearing.

The CCAA will follow a similar schedule this year's budget preparation in adherence to the NRS for local government entities. Therefore, a final draft of the tentative budget needs to be completed by the March 18, 2020 CCAA meeting.

#### **DISCUSSION**

Staff has prepared draft budget for review by CCAA Board. Preliminary reviews of proposed draft budget will be conducted with CCAA Treasurer Jon Rogers and CCAA Board Chair Michael Golden. Subsequent changes and modifications will be made based upon input from Board members, Board Chair and Board Treasurer. Finally, Beth Kohn-Cole, auditor for the CCAA, will review and organize tentative budget for submission to the Nevada Department of Taxation.

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

Review and set parameters for development of an intermediate and long-term facility and Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) and funding scheme for CCAA final approval.

#### **PURPOSE**

Staff seeks to develop an intermediate and long-term facility and equipment CIP in order to replace aging equipment and upgrade aging facilities over the intermediate (3-10 years) and long-term (10-20 years).

#### **BACKGROUND**

During the strategic planning process, the CCAA identified the strategic goal of maintaining airport infrastructure in top condition. The initiative that arose from that goal was the development of an intermediate and long-term facility and equipment CIP. The majority of airport infrastructure (e.g. runways, taxiways, common use aprons, airport lighting, etc.) is eligible for FAA grant funding and is a part of the airport master development plan. The CCAA is responsible for 6.25% share of the costs associated with Airport Capital Improvement Plan projects. The CCAA is responsible for the costs associated with upgrading facilities and replacing or acquiring equipment owned by the CCAA.

#### **DISCUSSION**

At the November 2019 CCAA meeting, the airport manager and CCAA Treasurer, Jon Rogers, met to outline the parameters of an intermediate and long-term facility and equipment CIP and discussed ideas how the CCAA would fund the CIP. One funding scheme involves the creation of an Equipment Fund that would be designated for Intermediate Equipment Replacement and a separate Facilities Project Fund for the repair or replacement facilities on a scheduled basis. Another scheme is a process that utilizes the normal budget process to identify capital projects or equipment that need replacing or upgrading. In the FY 19/20 Budget the CCAA identified some terminal upgrades. However, when the CCAA needed to replace the airport tractor due to the equipment fire, the CCAA didn't have a plan in place or designated funds on hand to procure new equipment.

Staff has identified the need to replace the flatbed maintenance truck to coincide with the construction of the SRE building. Two significant long-term projects include the replacement of

the terminal building and future replacement of the parking lot. Possible funding sources include designation of rock sale royalties, LGIP accrued interest and other non-aeronautical revenue, i.e. cell tower leases. These sources of revenue could generate between \$75,000-\$100,000 annually, allowing for the accumulation of funds to meet the future needs of the CCAA.

The development and implementation of the CIP is in support of the strategic goal of "Maintaining Airport Infrastructure in Top Condition."

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

The total estimated cost of the CIP is \$292,000 excluding proposed land acquisition in the first five years and \$1,086,000 over the period between 6 and 20 years excluding proposed land acquisition costs.

"I move to approve airport staff to create a final draft of an Intermediate and Long-Term Facility and Equipment CIP and funding scheme for CCAA final approval."

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

#### **PURPOSE**

Staff seeks approval of lease amendment for Mountainview community association lease.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Sierra Skyway, LLC executed a lease for lot 219B with the CCAA in December 2017. In June 2018, Sierra Skyway, LLC broke ground on phase 1 of a potential 3 phase development of corporate box hangars. In January 2019, Sierra Skyway, LLC requested assignment of the ground lease to Mountainview Community Association, a company structured to manage the common areas of the constructed hangar project.

At the July 17, 2019 CCAA meeting, Sierra Skyway, LLC requested a lease amendment to adjust the 219B lot lines to accommodate the inclusion of two fire riser rooms that were constructed on land not included within the leased parcel. The CCAA approved the lease amendment.

In July 2019, Mountainview Community Association received a Certificate of Occupancy from the Carson City Building Department, completing construction of the first phase. On November 25, 2019, submitted a letter to airport staff exercise the option detailed in Section 3B of the ground lease allowing for the lessee to return Phase 2 & 3 of Lot 219B to the CCAA.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The draft legal description and lease amendment have been completed and are attached for Board consideration. The legal description has been reviewed by airport consulting engineer, Armstrong Associates and the draft amendment language has been reviewed by airport legal counsel, Steve Tackes. The Phase 1 parcel has been adjusted to 31,792.30 sf and the remaining Phase 2/3 parcel is 64,217.49 sf.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

The financial impact to the CCAA is the lost income that was derived from the increase set to be trigger by the Section 3B of the ground lease. The total loss of revenue in the next six months is approximately \$7,900.00 January 2020 – June 30, 2020.

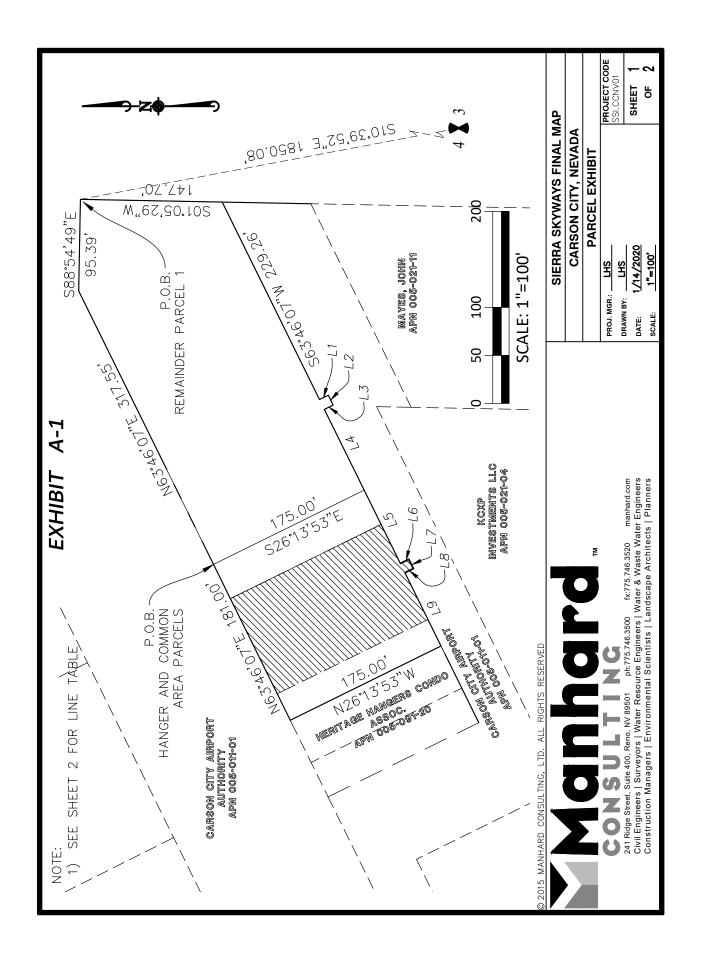

- Rev Jet 360 is an on-line software tool that allows the airport to automate and airport tenants and users to manage a range of services on-line. The airport is beta testing site for this program developed by Delasoft, a Delaware Corporation. Airport staff has assisted in the program design for the purposes of meeting the needs of an airport like Carson City. In exchange for the airport staff's time and effort in the design and development process, the airport gets to use the tool without charge. This is a great benefit for the airport tenants and users by allowing them to manage a range of activities from the comfort of their home or office 24/7/365. The airport benefits by automating these time-consuming manual processes and improves record keeping and information collection.
- Airport Emergency Addressing project is in progress and should be complete within the next few weeks.
- Airport staff worked with Carson Reno Lumber to resolve the issue of marking the yard lights near the property fence with a red beacon which was identified as a safety concern during the annual airport inspection.
- On Thursday, January 9<sup>th</sup>, airport staff was notified by Scott Thompson od Sacramento FAA Flight Inspection Operations, that the issuing a Notice to Airman (NOTAM) stating the Runway 27 Precision Approach Path Indicator is no longer useable beyond 1.30 nautical miles effective immediately. Airport staff is consultation with the airport consulting engineers, airport district office, FAA NAS Planning & Implementation lead planner regarding this issue. This issue came to light during the discussions regarding the nighttime instrument approach restriction.
- Open House Save-the-Date has been distributed. The Open House and 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Chicken Wing Cook-off is planned for June 27, 2020.
- Effective November 14, 2019, the airport manager, as president-elect of the Nevada Airports Association (NvAA), assumed the duties and responsibilities of the President of the NvAA for the remainder of the previous president's term.
- Airport Manager will be attending the SWAAAE Board meeting and winter conference in Monterey, California on January 25-29, 2020. While in Monterey, the airport manager will be participating in a round table discussion collaborating with other state aviation directors from California, Arizona and Nevada.

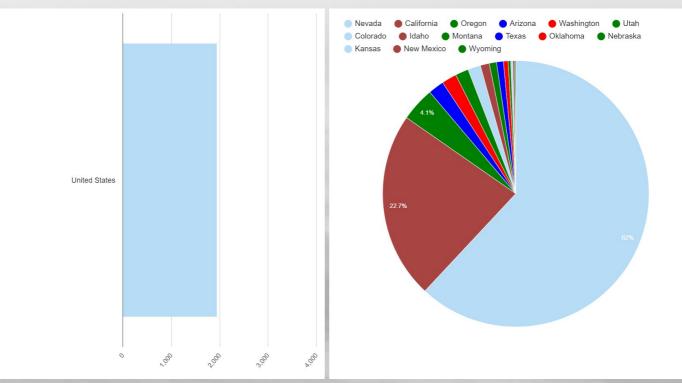

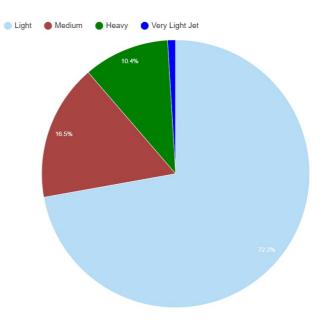

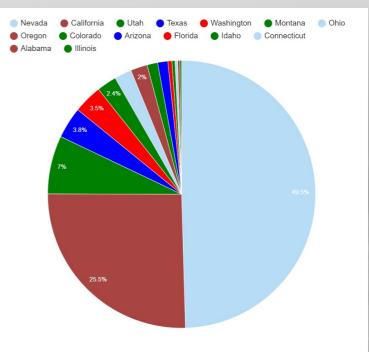

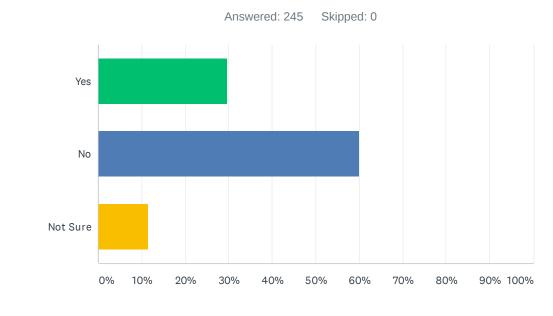
# Q2 Do you think changing the airport name to Carson City Airport more clearly defines where the airport is located in the United States than Carson Airport?

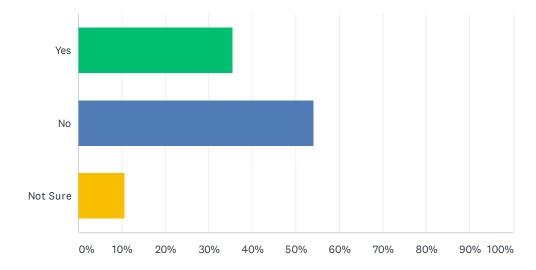

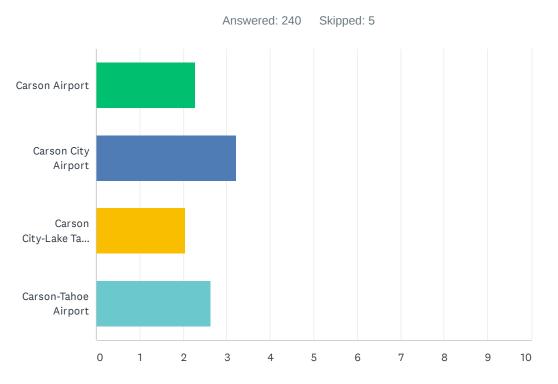
